The purpose of these methods is to gather rich, contextual insights into the practical application of these laws and policies, particularly in the context of public facilities. The findings reveal a dichotomy: there is a commendable legal framework established by the Indonesian government to safeguard the rights of people with disabilities. However, the research also uncovers a significant gap in the actual implementation of these laws, indicating the need for more rigorous and attentive enforcement of these regulations. The research concludes by emphasizing the urgent need for the government to intensify its efforts in faithfully executing these policies to ensure that the rights of people with disabilities are actively protected and promoted in Jakarta, not just recognized in theory.
