JUSTICE PROBLEMS IN REHABILITATION RIGHTS FULFILLMENT FOR DRUG ADDICTS AND/OR DRUG ABUSE VICTIMS FROM THE PRESPECTIVE OF DIGNIFIED JUSTICE THEORY
